

MUNICIPAL CORPORATION CHANDIGARH ORDER

Whereas, the Chief Administrator, Chandigarh Administration had issued the "Bye-Laws for the regulation and control of Cow-Sheds in Chandigarh" vide Notification bearing no. 7118-UTFI(4)-91/2147 dated 05.03.1991.

And whereas, the said bye-laws continued to be applicable to the whole of the Chandigarh till the formulation of the Municipal Corporation Chandigarh on 24.05.1994.

And whereas, after the formulation of the Municipal Corporation Chandigarh, the aforesaid bye-laws continued to be applicable in terms of the provisions contained in Section 428-A (2) (b) of the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976 as extended to the Union Territory, Chandigarh w.e.f. 24.05.1994 by the Punjab Municipal Corporation Law (Extension to Chandigarh) Act, 1994 (Act No. 45 of 1994).

And whereas, it has become necessary to regulate and control the menace of the animals i.e. horned cattle, horses, ponies, mules and asses in the Municipal Area of Chandigarh.

And whereas, the House of the Municipal Corporation Chandigarh in its 164th meeting held on 28.02.2011 has unanimously resolved the agenda of banning cattle rearing in the Municipal Area of Chandigarh.

Now, therefore, the Municipal Corporation Chandigarh hereby directs as follows:-

No person shall keep or allowed to keep any animal i.e. horned cattle, horses, ponies, mules and asses in Chandigarh in any place, site or building other than the licensed cow house or stable within municipal limits of Chandigarh.

The owners of the animals i.e. horned cattle, horses, ponies, mules and asses in Chandigarh, who have kept the animals in any place site or building other than the licensed Cow house or stable within the Municipal Limits of the Chandigarh are hereby given an opportunity direction to remove their animals within a period of 6 months from the date of issuance of these orders failing which action will be taken in accordance with the aforesaid bye-laws of 1991. Besides this, any person, who is found to be violating these orders/Bye-Laws, his/her animal will be seized and become the property of Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, to be disposed off as deemed fit.
