At the outset, the Mayor welcomed the officers, members & media persons. He further apprised the House that Sh. Jai Ram Joshi, who was renowned

mass leader of Chandigarh had expired and we should observe two minutes silence to pay the homage to the departed soul.

Smt. Heera Negi told that Sh. Shubham, a media person of Chandigarh had also expired recently and two minutes silence should be observed to pay the homage to the departed soul.

***“The House observed two minutes silence to pay the homage to Sh. Jai Ram Joshi.”***

The Councillors of BJP welcomed Smt. Kashmiri Devi, Councillor, by thumping the tables, who had joined the BJP.

Sh. Subhash Chawla condemned the act of the Councillors of BJP as they have started beating the tables immediately after paying the homage to the departed soul.

Thereafter, there was din in the House.

The House was adjourned at 11.30 a.m. and resumed at 11.55 a.m.

Sh. Subhash Chawla said that the BJP Councillors have started beating the tables immediately after paying the homage to the departed soul, therefore, they had insulted the deceased leader. They should tender an apology to the House.

Sh. Satish Kumar Kainth & Sh. Darshan Kumar sat on dharna in the well under protest demanding either the Councillors of BJP should tender an apology otherwise they would continue on dharna.

The House was again adjourned at 12.30 pm. and reassembled at 12.45 p.m.

Sh. M.P. Kohli requested the members of both parties to maintain decorum in the House and start the proceedings of the House amicably. He said that in spite of repeated requests members of both the parties had been creating ruckus, therefore, he stated that the nominated members would walk out of the House under protest.

#### **AGENDA ITEM NO.212.1**

**Confirmation of the minutes of 211th meeting of the General House held on 31.10.2014 at 11.00 a.m. & Special meeting held on 19.11.2014 at 11.00 a.m. in the Assembly Hall of the MC, Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.1 for consideration and confirmation.

The MOH pointed out that at page 24 of minutes of 211<sup>th</sup> meeting of the House held on 31.10.2014, the extension for hiring 20 No. tractor trolleys may be read upto 28.2.2015 as mentioned in the agenda instead of three months.

**“The House approved extension for hiring 20 No. tractor trolleys from 1.11.2014 to 28.2.2015.”**

***“The House confirmed the minutes of 211<sup>th</sup> meeting & Special meeting of the General House held on 31.10.2014 at 11.00 a.m. & 19.11.2014 at 11.00 a.m. respectively in the Assembly Hall of the M.C., Chandigarh, with above amendment.”***

#### **AGENDA ITEM NO.212.2**

**To consider and to approve amendment in regulation 3 of the notification of Chandigarh Municipal Corporation (Employees Pension and GPF Regulations, 2000 for releasing of pension/retirement benefits to the erstwhile employees of the Market Committee, U.T., Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.2 for consideration and approval.

Sh. Satinder Singh said that the name of Market Committee, Chandigarh may be incorporated in Regulation 3 of the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation (Employees, Pension & GPF) Regulation 2000, which is based on Section 428A of the Punjab Municipal Act, 1976. He read out the contents of Section 428A of the Punjab Municipal Act. According to the said Section, the transferred functions by the Administration would be the functions of the Corporation automatically. He further apprised that the Market Committee was the part of Agricultural Marketing Board, Chandigarh. He further read out the different functions of the Board defined in the Act of Board. He further said that the Market Committee had a separate entity and the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh, was the Secretary of the Market Committee. He further said that the definition of the Administrator under Board's Act & under Section 239 of the Constitution were different. He further said that no function of the Market Committee was transferred to the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. He further said that all the expenses are incurred by the parent department of the employees, therefore, all the liabilities are to be borne by the Market Committee, Chandigarh in case of these 12 transferred employees working in the Fire & Emergency Services of Fire Department. He further apprised these 12 persons had been the employees of Market Committee and had been working with the Chandigarh Fire Services till 1995. Their salary and other allowances was being paid by the Market Committee since 1985 to 1995. But from 1999-2000 the Municipal Corporation started to pay them. He read out the contents of letter dated 26.3.1998 written to the Finance Secretary by the then Secretary, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. In response to the said letter, the Finance Secretary wrote the Corporation vide letter dated 07.07.1998 and sought the willingness of the Corporation whether or not they want to take over the fire staff of market committee. The Municipal Corporation gave the willingness dated 28.10.1998

and stated there was no objection for transferring the fire staff of market committee to the Corporation. He further read the contents of letter dated 28.10.1998, vide which the terms & conditions had been defined. He further said that the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh came into existence on 6<sup>th</sup> December, 1996 and the first election of the Mayor was also held in December, 1996. He read out the contents of the Audit objections at page No.16 of the agenda note. He further said that these 12 employees of the market committee were not technically absorbed in the Corporation. He further read out the contents of order dated 2.1.1989 placed at page No.6 of agenda. He further said according to his opinion the order of the Administrator 2.1.1989 and Section 428A of the Punjab Municipal Act, are totally different to each other. He further said that as per the observation of the Administrator, the audit objection was wrong. He further read out the definition of the Administrator and the definition of the Administrator of Marketing Board, both are totally different to each other. He opined that the pension & other liabilities should be borne by the parent department of the said employees because in view of the facts mentioned above, it is not the liability of the Corporation.

The Commissioner apprised that there were three wings of fire services i.e. Administration, NAC, Manimajra & Market Committee before the inception of Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. He further apprised that ultimately the Fire & Emergency Services Department of the Administration was transferred to the Corporation under the transferred functions & the fire services of NAC Manimajra were automatically transferred to the Corporation & the fire services of the Market Committee alongwith posts & employees were transferred to the Corporation by the Administrator, U.T. Chandigarh vide order dated 2.1.1999. He further invited the attention of the House towards page 8 of the agenda note and the audit objection was for procedural matter. He further read the contents of the notification dated 9.1.2001 and according to the notification the employees were transferred from NAC, CITCO & Administration on

or after 24<sup>th</sup> day of May,1994, are deemed to be the employee of the Corporation, but the name of these 12 employees had not been mentioned in the notification. He further said that the advise of the Chief Auditor was very much clear in the case of Sh. Jagjiwan Singh Kang and he had advised for amendment in rules. He further said similar situated persons were getting the pension prior to the case of Sh. Jagjiwan Singh. According to advise of the Chief Auditor, the case was referred to the Administration for notification, but the Administration said the order dated 2.1.1999 issued in this regard was sufficient. He further said the agenda had been brought to include these 12 employees transferred from Market Committee in the staff of Fire & Emergency Services, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh as they had already been working with the Corporation since long time.

Major D.S. Sandhu (Retd.) said that the letter dated 19.9.2014 from the Administration was self explanatory vide which it has been clarified that the retired benefits for the service rendered before transfer to the Corporation should be recovered from the Market Committee. He further suggested that Regulation No.3 should be amended in order to include their names.

Sh. Des Raj Gupta apprised that he remained the Chairman & Director of the Market Committee, the Market Committee was not in position to pay the salary & other allowances to the fire staff, therefore, the proposal for transfer of these employees to the Corporation was sent by the market committee. He emphasized that these employees should be given all benefits without any discrimination.

Sh. Subhash Chawla said that the employees had been facing stress and he was in favour of the approval of the agenda. He further suggested that the Corporation should create its own cadre of the employees.

Sh. Satinder Singh said that there would be more litigation and said that the legal opinion would have been obtained before putting the agenda in the House.

The Law Officer clarified that the order dated 2.1.1999 had been passed by the Administrator and notification dated 28.9.1995 was the same thing and there is no ambiguity in the order passed by the Administrator for transferring 12 No. posts alongwith employees working in the Market Committee, U.T. Chandigarh and no need to amend the notification.

Sh. M.P.Kohli said that the matter had been lingering on since long time and suggested that if the House is empowered, we should approve the agenda.

***“The House considered & accorded approval to amend & add the name of the Market Committee, U.T. Chandigarh in Regulation No.3 of the Notification of Chandigarh Municipal Corporation (Employees Pension & GPF) Regulation, 2000.”***

### **AGENDA ITEM NO.212.3**

**Disposal of old obsolete/ unserviceable material lying in P.H. Store Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.3 for consideration and approval.

The Chief Engineer said that a Committee had been constituted in this regard, which would submit its findings and the agenda would be brought again in the House after proposing the reserve price, terms & conditions by the Committee.

Sh. Subhash Chawla asked whether the inventory of the articles to be condemned had been prepared or not? There would be the futile exercise of the committee without inventory of the articles, the Committee wants to know when the articles were purchased, when these were issued & when they were collected for condemnation.

Dr. Amrit Tiwari expressed her experience that some times the articles are not issued from the store, but put for condemnation. She further suggested that it should be noted by the committee when the material was purchased, issued from the

store and how much time used before condemnation. It is a serious matter and we should not condemn the articles without inventory.

Sh. Arun Sood demanded that Sh. Surinder Bahga should be included in the Committee.

Sh. Davesh Moudgil also supported the demand of Sh. Arun Sood and said that the services of Sh. Surinder Bahga should be utilized.

Sh. Raj Bala said that one member from all the parties & one nominated Councillor should be included in the Committee.

The Commissioner said that the Mayor would consider the views of the Councillors, when the Committee would be constituted.

Sh. Surinder Bahga said that the estimate of Rs. 1.75 crore was prepared for un-used articles. He further said that the office note is self explanatory that this material could not be consumed, it is not abandoned or condemned material. He further apprised the House that 234 tonne cast iron pipes had been lying in the store and the life of these pipes is 200 years and present value of these pipes is Rs. 1.50 crore in the market. He further asked why these pipes had not been used in the construction of M.C. building and it should be ensured that no cast iron pipes had been purchased so far. He further said that 25 tonne wire was purchased, but not used so far, therefore, accountability of the purchasing authority should be fixed. He further apprised the House that 1650 fire hydrants had been dumped there. He apprehended that the above mentioned material is new which could not be used and the new material would have been purchased for the construction. He again said that it should be ensured that the new material had not been purchased beside this abandoned material and the accountability should be fixed for not to use the material so far.

The Commissioner said that as and when the Committee would submit its report, then the House would accord its approval for auction.

***“The House considered & approved the Committee constituted for this purpose and it was further decided that Committee will submit its findings before the House for approval.”***

**AGENDA ITEM NO.212.4**

**Requirement of field staff for the maintenance of Public Health Services under the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.4 for consideration and approval.

Sh. Satish Kainth said that 1217 employees had been outsourced on contract and there was shortfall of 1963 employees as per norms. He further asked whether such type of agenda was ever been brought in the House for the approval of non-plan expenditure.

The Commissioner said that this agenda is only for discussion and for information of the House. He further apprised that the approval of non-plan expenditure had not been obtained, it comes within the preview of Chief Engineer.

The Chief Engineer apprised that for the maintenance of road gullies & water supply system, 1217 employees had been outsourced as per norms & expenditure on their salaries is incurred under the non-plan head and this agenda is only for information of the House. He further said the power of non-plan vested with the Chief Engineer as per PWD manual, but the expenditure of plan-head is brought for the approval of the House through Sub Committees.

Sh. Subhash Chawla said that it had been the problem since 1996, what should be the status of non-plan head, sometimes, it had been the cause of conflict between the Mayor and the Officers. He further said according to the provisions laid down in the manual, the Chief Engineer is empowered to incur the expenditure under non-plan head. He further said if the members are agreed, the expenditure of non-plan should also be brought for the approval of House through committees like the plan

expenditure. He further said that the certain news had been published in the newspapers regarding tenders, which could not be denied and due to the comments, it had been admitted that the concerned officers would be charge sheeted and action would be taken against them. He further said that it reveals from the newspapers that the section of manual had been mis-used. He further said if the approval of any work even for Rs. 10,000/- under plan head is accorded, the concerned councillor is informed that the estimate of such and such work has been approved, but no councillors knows about the work for which the tenders has been floated under non-plan head, when & where the work has been done & even the payment has been made. This practice has been prevailing since 1996. He further said that it reveals from the first instance of the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act i.e. delegation of power, but no such agenda has been brought in the House till date. The manuals are applicable on the non-elected bodies. He further said that some of the Municipal Corporations had framed their own manual. He further said that this is the first instance, whether the non-plan expenditure should be brought/discussed in the House. He suggested that there should be a detailed discussion today on this issue. He further said that in emergency cases, the expenditure is incurred from non-plan head, but the ex-post-facto approval should be obtained from the House and the concerned area councillors should also be informed accordingly.

The Commissioner apprised that an amount of about Rs. 174 crore is incurred on salary, which is permanent expenditure from non-plan. Secondly, the expenditure is incurred from the non-plan head in emergency cases. He further said that the powers of Committees & officers had been defined in the Punjab Municipal Code. If House agreed, we should adopt the Punjab Municipal Code or frame our own Municipal Code, which would be notified by the Administrator. He further said when the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh came into existence, there was no manual or

municipal code with the Corporation, it followed the Chandigarh Administration and adopted the PWD manual. He further said more than 20 years had passed but the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh did not frame its own manual. He further said that a Committee was constituted for framing the Corporation manual under the Chairmanship of Sh. Pardeep Chhabra, but nothing was done so far.

Sh. Davesh Moudgil said that the CPWD manual also had not been followed in toto. If it would have been followed properly, the functioning of the Corporation would have been smooth. He further said that there were provisions in the Municipal Act also and a detailed discussion requires on this issue.

Smt. Harjinder Kaur apprised in the House earlier the maximum expenditure was incurred in the non-plan head and there was no budget under plan head. She further suggested that either the CPWD manual or Punjab PWD manual should be adopted in toto. She further said that the budget of plan head & non-plan head was passed by the House and the expenditure incurred under both the head should be brought for the approval of the House. She further said that the committee already constituted should be revived, in which the experienced councillors should be involved for framing the own municipal code. She stressed that the ex-post-facto approval should be minimized.

Sh. Subhash Chawla said that information of all the works to be done under Non-Plan head should be provided to all the Councillors.

Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.) congratulated the Commissioner & Chief Engineer for imparting transparency in functioning by bringing this agenda in the House. He further said that it reveals from the newspapers the powers delegated to the officers had been misused by splitting over the work, which was over & above the powers of officers and this practice should be avoided. There should be uniformity in the rates and there should be check on the rates.

Sh. Arun Sood said that the transparency in the functioning of the Corporation is necessary. He further said that the meeting of the already constituted Committee should be called at the earliest for adopting the municipal code. He further read out the figures of total staff, regular staff, short fall & outsourced staff. He asked the reasons of short fall of staff and due to this short fall the work is not done immediately. He stressed for the recruitment of staff to fill the gap of short fall. He further suggested that a sucking machine for open the road gullies should be purchased and reiterated that the required staff & machinery should be hired.

Smt. Gurbax Rawat said a complaint centre has been launched, but the complaint filed in the centre exclusively relating to the Public Health Wing could not be solved within time. She further apprised the House that there was a major complaints of electricity in Chandigarh Administration, which had been privatized to redress the complaints of the public and working smoothly. She further suggested that the more staff should be appointed to attend the complaints over head. She further suggested that the staff of public health wing should be segregated for the regular work and to attend the complaints.

The Commissioner said that complaint centre is a new project and we shall forward step by step to redress the complaints, otherwise maximum complaints had been redressed and it has been appreciated by the public. He admitted the shortage of staff according to the functions transferred by the Administration.

Smt. Harjinder Kaur said that no food waste bye-laws had been framed by the Corporation. She apprised about the rat menace in Chandigarh, which may be the cause of plague in future. She further apprised that this problem is more in Sector-35 being the hotels & demanded a scheme should be launched in this respect and it should be ensured that the food waste should not come in the sewer.

The Commissioner said that the opinion of the DHS would be obtained, so far as the opinion of the then MOH is concerned the killing of rats was the reason of plague in Surat.

Sh. Arun Sood said that a meat market is situated in Sector-37 near green belt and due to said market, the sewerage lines are blocked. He has apprised the SDE & Executive Engineer about the problem, but no action has been taken against the meat shop owner. No notice has been issued to the bakery shop owner in Sector 37-D & meat shop owner in Sector 37-C in spite of repeated requests of the area Councillors.

***“The House resolved that a meeting of the already constituted committee be called at the earliest to frame the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation Code.***

***It was also resolved that the information of the works to be done under non-plan head be given to concerned Councillors.”***

#### **AGENDA ITEM NO.212.5**

**Amendment of Clause 6 of the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation(Tax on Commercial, Industrial and Institutional Lands & Buildings) Bye-Laws-2003 (Page 1325).**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.5 for consideration and approval.

The Commissioner apprised that a correction is required in the resolution i.e. Assessment Year be read 2015-16 instead of 2014-15 and the resolution be read as under :-

***“The House considered & approved the amendment as proposed in the agenda and this amendment be come into force from the Assessment Year 2015-16 i.e. from 1.4.2015.***

***It was further resolved that if the last date of depositing of tax by cheque/D.D. happens to be a holiday, then the next working day should be considered the last date for depositing tax.”***

**AGENDA ITEM NO.212.6****Request for Temporary Water and Sewerage Connection in H.No.264/10, Gali No.11, Shanti Nagar, Manimajra, U.T., Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed agenda item No.6 for consideration and approval.

Smt. Heera Negi apprised the House that MRD Model High School, Manimajra, had been running in House No.264/10, Gali No.11, Shanti Nagar, Manimajra, in which the students of weaker section had been studying and requested to pass this agenda and temporary water & sewerage connection should be allowed there.

Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.) said that according to the rules & regulations of Estate Office, no school could be opened in the residential area. What would be the repercussions if the school is allowed in the residential area? Therefore, the legal aspects should be examined. He opposed the temporary connection of water & sewerage to this school to avoid the further litigation.

Sh. Arun Sood said that the building of this school was constructed prior to the enforcement of present building bye-laws. He further said that many people are effected by not giving the temporary water & sewerage connection. This building is without sanctioned plan and violations exist there. He further said the electricity connection had been provided by the Administration there. Therefore, the NOC for water connection should be exempted in such cases and stressed that the temporary water & sewerage connection should be allowed.

The Commissioner apprised that the norms for electricity connection & water connection are different, the water connection can not be allowed without NOC.

Sh. Gurcharan Dass Kala said that there is no problem of water & sewerage connection in Shanti Nagar. He further said why this agenda has been brought in the House without his knowledge/consent.

***“The House decided that a Committee consisting of sh. Gurcharan Dass Kala, Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.), Smt. Poonam Sharma, Councillors, be constituted to ascertain the issue and submit report within a week.***

***The Committee will further co-opt 2-3 officers of the concerned wing of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.”***

**TABLE AGENDA ITEM NO.212.1**

**P/L 30mm thick bituminous concrete on slow carriage way along V-3 road in between Sector 17 & 18 on 17 side and Sector 21 & 22, on side Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed table agenda item No.1 for consideration and approval.

***“The House considered & resolved that the estimate amounting to Rs.73.57 lac for P/L 30mm thick bituminous concrete on slow carriage way along V-3 road in between Sector 17 & 18 on 17 side and Sector 21 & 22, on side Chandigarh, be and is hereby approved.”***

**TABLE AGENDA ITEM NO.212.2**

**Rough cost estimate for recarpetting of V-5 road of Sector-7, Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed table agenda item No.2 for consideration and approval.

***“The House considered & resolved that the rough cost estimate amounting to Rs.54.70 lac for recarpetting of V-5 road of Sector-7, Chandigarh, be and is hereby approved.”***

**TABLE AGENDA ITEM NO.212.3**

**Rough cost estimate for constructing of parking and widening of road back side of Saini Bhawan- Balmiki Mandir and in front of Mayor Rajpur area near Mandir, Mohyal Bhawan & other Bhawan in Sector 24-C, Chandigarh.**

The Secretary placed table agenda item No.3 for consideration and approval.

***“The House considered & resolved that the rough cost estimate amounting to Rs.70.78 lac for constructing of parking and widening of road back side of Saini Bhawan- Balmiki Mandir and in front of Mayor Rajpur area near Mandir, Mohyal Bhawan & other Bhawan in Sector 24-C, Chandigarh, be and is hereby approved.”***

**TABLE AGENDA ITEM NO.212.4**

**Extension of contract for the supply of 173 Safaikaramcharies through service provider.**

The Secretary placed table agenda item No.4 for consideration and approval.

The Commissioner apprised the House that fresh e-tender was floated for hiring of 673 safaikaramcharies. Only two bids were received out of which only one bid was technically qualified. Hence, it was decided to recall the tender due to insufficient competition. Therefore, the extension for three months may be allowed for 173 safaikaramcharies.

***“The House considered & approved extension of three months for the supply of 173 Safaikaramcharies from M/s Keshav Security Pvt. Ltd. w.e.f. 1.12.2014 to 28.2.2015 on existing terms & conditions or till the finalization of new tender, whichever is earlier.”***

Sh. Arun Sood said that out of 90 safaikramcharies those were engaged for Swachha Bharat Abhiyaan, about 15 safaikaramcharies met him and complaint that

the less wages had been paid to them and their attendance also had not been marked. It is an atrocity on the poor people. He demanded the inquiry in this episode. He further said that there was awareness in the public about Swachha Bharat Abhiyaan and it is the demand of the public that this programme should be continued for sometime more. He suggested for six months extension for the safaikaramcharies engaged for Swachha Bharat Abhiyaan.
